**THE DEVIL IS IN THE DETAILS
"ASSESSMENT OF CRIME SCENES AND
THE LITTLE THINGS WE MISS"**



Rod Englert lectures nationally and internationally on many aspects of homicide investigations, including blood pattern analysis, gunshot wounds and trajectory paths, DNA collection, state-of-the-art forensic techniques, courtroom evidence, and officer-involved shootings. He has conducted more than 600 lectures and training sessions for police officers, investigators, attorneys, prosecutors, medical examiners, and forensic laboratory personnel, among other attendees.

This presentation will acquaint the investigator with techniques that can be utilized at violent crime scenes and will enhance the solvability factor, especially if we recognize "What Isn't So." In addition to a psychological crime scene assessment, other considerations are: the use of alternate light sources, Luminol, aspects of gunshot wounds, and blood patterns related to reconstruction.

The lecture consists of slides and video of pertinent homicide cases related to the topic "Crime Scene Assessment." Examples of staged and manipulated scenes will be shown involving the "Little Devil in the Details" that changed the course of the investigations. The lecture will transition into the session related to "Courtroom Preparation and Testimony."

**THE POLICE FOUNDATION REVIEW OF THE
CHRISTOPHER DORNER INCIDENT**

"This incident represents a sentinel event in American policing – one that serves as a warning of needed changes in the public safety system," said Police Foundation President Jim Bueermann, who put the foundation's review team together. "A trained former police officer was hunting police officers and their families, exploiting geo-political, jurisdictional and technological boundaries and using legally-acquired, sophisticated, high-powered weaponry." Executive Director Susan Rahr was part of the review team and will present a summary of the foundation's review of the Dorner incident.

NORTH BEND HOMICIDE/BUNKER CASE

CASE REVIEW – SPOKANE COUNTY WALLACE HOMICIDE

Charles “Charlie” R. Wallace was the subject of an ongoing investigation by the Spokane Regional Drug Task Force (SRDTF). Wallace was wanted as a fugitive on federal charges after being sentenced to local drug treatment by a federal judge in lieu of a recommended prison term. On June 19, 2012, members of the SRDTF were attempting to locate Wallace. Spokane County Deputy Spink and Deputy Northway received information from SRDTF investigators that known associates of Wallace were in the area of North Spokane and task force officers requested Deputies Spink and Northway to assist with an investigative stop of the associated vehicle. The deputies were ambushed by Wallace, who was in the vehicle and wearing a disguise.



Both deputies were shot and Wallace fled on foot before carjacking a nearby elderly woman and leading law enforcement on a lengthy pursuit, which resulted in a major collision and Wallace shooting himself to death.

Although Deputy Northway was the most severely injured from the attack, he is back to work with Spokane County Sheriff's Office and the department has lost three other deputies as emotional casualties of this incident.

This presentation will highlight the judicial, investigative, tactical, and post-incident responses to one of the most significant incidents in recent history for Spokane law enforcement.
