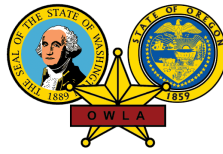


OWLA Fall Conference Training Announcement

**The Oregon-Washington Lawmen's Association Fall 2011 Training Conference
will be held at the Best Western Icicle Inn, Leavenworth, Washington.**

PULLING THE TRIGGER – A 25-YEAR STUDY OF DEADLY FORCE ENCOUNTERS BY LAW ENFORCEMENT Instructor – Larry C. Brubaker, Retired FBI Agent

Pulling the trigger is something that no police officer wants to do, but an officer is sworn to serve and protect members of society. Unfortunately, shootings do occur and when a shooting results in the death of a citizen, emotions erupt from the public, media, the decedent's family and the law enforcement community. Sides are taken and opinions are abundant.

Retired FBI Agent Brubaker is the author of the 2008 book *Pulling the Trigger: A 25-Year Study of Deadly Force Encounters by Law Enforcement*. He will discuss in detail the history of deadly force encounters by law enforcement officers and the relating constitutional decisions. Conference attendees will learn about the constitutional amendments and state statutes regarding methodology used during the research, and statistical data regarding the incidents. The remaining instruction will be case studies of approximately 40 of the 149 fatal shooting deaths. Included in the case studies are crime scene photographs, video and audio recordings. The results of interviews of Minnesota peace officers who were involved in shooting deaths will also be presented, focusing on training, perceptual changes, weaponry, and post-shooting events.

Mr. Brubaker has taught various crime topic classes throughout the world and has been featured on National Public Radio, Primetime Live, 48 Hours, MSNBC News, Court TV, and the Discovery Health Network. He currently is retired from the FBI and stays busy as a business owner and as an adjunct professor at two Minnesota universities.

PORTLAND JOINT TERRORISM TASK FORCE (JTTF): 9/11 AND THE "PORTLAND 7" CASE Instructor – Dave Hallman, Retired FBI Agent

After 9/11, the Portland office of the FBI formed a JTTF consisting of representatives of many local, state, and federal agencies to fight terrorism in Oregon. In 2002, a plot by a group of seven local Muslims was discovered to go to Afghanistan to fight against U.S. and coalition forces on the behalf of al Qaeda. The investigation into this matter was deemed the "Portland 7" case. This presentation will detail the process of the discovery of the plot, its investigation, and the ultimate prosecution of six of the seven subjects. Also discussed will be the international manhunt for the seventh member of the group, Habis al Saoub, and his eventual death in Waziristan, a mountainous region of northern Pakistan, wherefrom al Saoub had been infiltrating with other al Qaeda members into Afghanistan to attack U.S. and coalition forces.

Instructor Dave Hallman is a retired FBI agent who arrived in Portland shortly prior to 9/11 and worked International Counterterrorism in Portland until he retired in early 2008 after 21 years of service. Prior to arriving in Portland, Hallman was a member of the FBI's Hostage Rescue Team (HRT), a full-time counterterrorist tactical team based in Quantico, Virginia, for seven years. He also served seven years in the Dallas office of the FBI. Hallman was the assistant team leader of the FBI Portland SWAT team and was a member of the FBI Dallas SWAT team. He is also a FBI certified Hostage Negotiator.
