“The Caffey Family Murders” – Murder Case Study



The case is about a 15 year old homeschooled girl who, along with her two younger brothers, was put into the public school system because their mother needed to earn extra income. The teen stepped into the freshman class at the local high school as a cute little blonde girl and instantly became the most popular girl among the boys. At the same time, she started working for a local fast food restaurant where the high school kids hung out. She began to enjoy her new found freedom and was mad that her parents attempt to rein her back in.

She developed a plan with her new boyfriend to eliminate her parents in order to keep her new found freedom. She eventually recruited three more people to carry out the plan. They shot and stabbed both parents and children, then set the house on fire. Her father was the only one who made it out of the house alive. As always, there are a lot of twists and turns in this case that were not shown on any television show.

Ranger Vance holds a Bachelor of Science degree from Sam Houston State University in Criminal Justice with a minor in Speech Communications. He holds certifications as a Master Peace Officer, Instructor, Firearms Instructor, DPS Weapons Armorer, Hostage Negotiations, Advanced Crime Scene Investigations, Homicide Investigations, Bloodstain pattern Analysis, and Special Investigations from the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement with over 4,000 hours of accredited training. Ranger Vance is also a certified Human Tracker.

Clackamas Town Center Mall Shooting Investigation

On December 11, 2012, a lone gunman entered the Clackamas Town Center Mall in Happy Valley, Oregon, and began shooting. The gunman, 22-year old Jacob Tyler Roberts, dressed in tactical clothing and wearing a hockey mask, fired as many as 60 shots from a semi-automatic rifle, killing two innocent shoppers inside the mall and wounding a third. Twenty-two minutes after the shooting began, officers found

the shooter dead in a service hall with a self-inflicted wound. The first part of the lecture will center on those very tense twenty-two minutes and the short period after in which patrol officers and deputies played a crucial role. You will be presented with an overview of the shooting and the response from a patrol sergeant's perspective. Instructors will discuss the role of a patrol sergeant during an active shooter incident.

Next, we will examine the tactics and training that worked during the response and those that fell short. We will also look at active shooter training models and examine if our current programs are up-to-date. Instructors will present tactical solutions for active shooter problems founded on an evidence based approach. We will look at tactics that have been tested and vetted under real conditions, along with expanding our views of active shooter training to incorporate tactics that officers can use in a variety of high risk calls.

4 Training Hours

Instructors – Sergeant Patrick Lynch, Oregon City Police Department & Sergeant Fred Kellogg, Clackamas County Sheriff's Office

- Sergeant Patrick Lynch with the Oregon City Police Department has been teaching tactics, use of force and active shooter for a number of years, in both the military and law enforcement communities. He has served his country in three tours to Afghanistan and Iraq in the last 10 years.
- Sgt. Fred Kellogg is a seasoned law enforcement officer with the Clackamas County Sheriff's Office. He has been a lead firearms instructor for his agency and is well-versed in tactics and active shooter scenarios.

Terror in the Grays Harbor County Courthouse



Grays Harbor Sheriff Rick Scott will present a case study with lessons learned of the incident that traumatized a community on March 9, 2012, at the Grays Harbor County Courthouse.

The presentation will provide an overview of the investigation of the shooting and stabbing of Deputy Polly Davin, along with the stabbing of Superior Court Judge David Edwards.

Sheriff Scott will provide aspects of the suspect development and the arrest. The presentation will also provide an overview of the trial and sentencing.
