Officer Involved Shooting Investigation: Undercover Officer Killed

In May of 2005, an undercover narcotics officer was shot and killed by two unknown suspects in St. Paul, Minnesota. This case presentation will detail the process of an officer involved shooting investigation, how detectives solved the crime, how a department dealt with the major internal issues this investigation discovered, and key lessons learned for undercover officers and the people who supervise drug/undercover units.

5 Training Hours

Instructor – Commander Steven Frazer, St. Paul Police Department

- *Instructor Steven Frazer is currently a Commander for the St. Paul Police Department Detective Division. He has been a police officer for 20 years and has spent the majority of his career in major crimes investigation as both a detective and a supervisor of detectives. Commander Frazer recently presented this case at the FBI National Academy in Quantico, VA.*

Miranda Complications in Murder Investigations: Informants

In August of 2005, St. Paul Police Detectives worked a homicide where the lead suspect was an Informant (CRI) for a narcotics team. His status as an informant led to numerous complications in a case that was eventually settled at the Minnesota Supreme Court. This case is an excellent case study and refresher on Miranda and its implications.

Human Trafficking Investigations: Learning to Identify & Combat Domestic Minor Sex Trafficking

This presentation will address law enforcement's changing response to human trafficking and specifically to the commercial sexual exploitation of children. Human trafficking encompasses prostitution (including street, internet-based, gang-based, and/or interfamilial prostitution), pornography, stripping, and escort services. These victims present unique challenges for the criminal justice system and this training will address:

- (1) how law enforcement is working to better respond to these cases by changing their approach to exploited children;**
- (2) how investigations can be improved with this new approach;**
- and (3) how we can keep victims on board throughout the legal process.**

Case studies will be included in this presentation.

4 Training Hours

*Instructors – Sergeant Michael Geiger & Detective Meghan Burkeen, Portland Police Bureau;
Victim Specialist Caroline Holmes, FBI*

- *Instructor Michael Geiger currently is a Sergeant for the Portland Police Bureau and is assigned to the Human Trafficking Detail and a member of the FBI Innocence Lost Task Force. He has been a police officer for 22 years. He has been working in investigative assignments for the last nine years, as a detective and sergeant, working in the Sexual Assault and Homicide Details.*
- *Instructor Meghan Burkeen currently is a Detective for the Portland Police Bureau and is assigned to the Human Trafficking Detail and also a member of the FBI Innocence Lost Task Force. She has been a police officer for ten years, working in investigative assignments for the last six years, as an officer and a detective, working in the Vice and Sexual Assault Details.*
- *Instructor Caroline Holmes has been working with victims of crime for more than 14 years. She began working with the FBI in 2006 as a Victim Specialist assigned to the Portland Division. In this position, Ms. Holmes works in close partnership with special agents to support victims of federal crime, including individuals who have experienced bank robbery, human trafficking, child sexual exploitation, and fraud. Ms. Holmes provides on-scene support to victims of crime, links them to appropriate services, and maintains contact with them during the duration of the investigation.*
