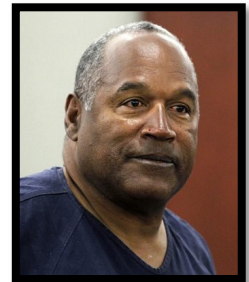

Arrest & Conviction of O. J. Simpson – Las Vegas Robbery Overview

On September 13, 2007, during the evening hours, a group of men led by O. J. Simpson broke into a room in the Palace Station Hotel in Las Vegas and stole various sports memorabilia from a dealer by gunpoint. O. J. Simpson was arrested a few days later for his involvement in the robbery and held without bail. On October 3, 2008, exactly 13 years to the day after he was acquitted of the murders of his ex-wife, Nicole Brown, and Ronald Goldman, Simpson was found guilty of all ten charges. Simpson was sentenced to 33 years in prison, with eligibility for parole in nine years (October 2017). Simpson is currently incarcerated at the Lovelock Correctional Center in Lovelock, Nevada.

Murder on the Las Vegas Strip

On the August 20, 2004, James Scholl got into the back seat of a Las Vegas cab and poured a small bottle full of gasoline on the cabdriver's head. When the cabdriver refused to give Scholl any money, Scholl lit a match and threw it on the driver. With no witnesses, Scholl ran from the cab leaving the cabdriver burning in the middle of the Las Vegas strip. The cabdriver died from his injuries. After bragging about robbing people like in the movie "Money Train", Scholl was identified as the suspect and was convicted based on circumstantial evidence. The circumstantial evidence was unconventional yet sufficient to hold Scholl accountable for murder.

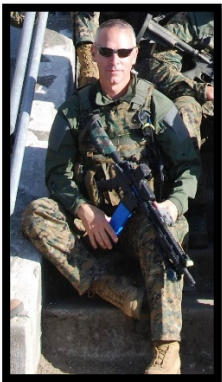
Gladstone Police Department Sergeant Lynn Benton agreed to pay \$2,000 to kill or have his estranged wife, Debbie Higbee-Benton, killed. The conspiracy regarding this homicide included a long-time friend of Lynn Benton's, Susan Campbell, and her son, Jason Jaynes. After several botched attempts and missed deadlines, the homicide was carried out, and on May 28, 2011, Debbie Higbee-Benton was found dead inside of her business in Gladstone, Oregon. Through the investigation and the collapse of Susan Campbell, the investigators learned of Lynn Benton's involvement in this homicide. A five-year and eight-month investigation was conducted, which resulted in the arrest, prosecution and conviction of Lynn Benton, Susan Campbell, and Jason Jaynes.
